As stated in the bylaws, in order to run for a seat on the Board or vote in the election you must be a Member in Good Standing (that is, dues

paid) two months prior to the election, which is September 16, 2011. Self-nomination forms will be available at our September general meeting, and they are due by our October general meeting.

COMING SOON – Original Penguin Artwork

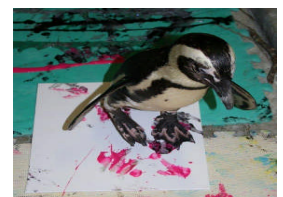
One of our members happens to have a connection with some very creative penguins who reside in a zoo in Tampa. She asked Tinkerbell and Titus if they would be interested

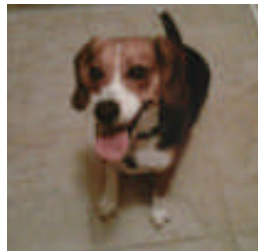

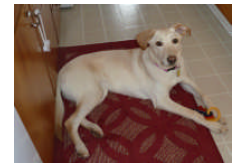


Happy Tails

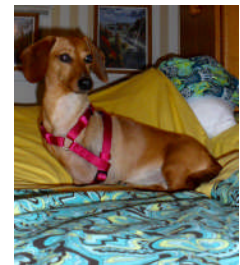
Lucy – Our 3-Legged Friend
