Shortly, thereafter Lorraine was diagnosed with liver cancer, so they began their brave fight together. They would discuss treatments, diets and "feelings." They lost their hair together and cried together. They managed to do all of this while continuing to do something they both loved, which was volunteering for PAWS.

Lorraine was the "sign maker" for events and she created the cage cards for our adoptable pets. Until the Spring of 2009, she handled all of the recordkeeping duties of PAWS, along with beautiful personalized thank you notes to people who contributed to the organization. In addition, she

also managed the membership roster for the group. Lorraine kept herself very busy and donated not only her time, but also necessary donated the supplies, stamps, paper, and any other items that were necessary to perform her duties to the cause.

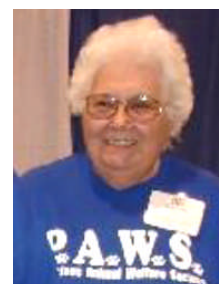
Lorraine was very dedicated to helping animals. Not many people know that her original involvement in animal rescue was fostering kittens. Years later, she would keep in touch with the adopters of those kittens and always made time to answer questions regarding cats and kittens and rescue work in general. Often she got phone calls from people who had been given her number to answer rescue questions. If she didn't know the answer, she would manage to find someone who did. She was always willing to go the extra mile!

Through her rescue work Lorraine developed a loyal camaraderie of friends. Not "just friends" but really good friends. She made the effort to take an interest in people's lives. She truly cared and was always ready to step in and help out – no matter what the need. She was a mentor to many who were both in the group or not part of the PAWS at all. While Lorraine was feeling her worst, she would continue to visit a friend's mom who was very sick and in a nursing home. She and would bring her little treats that she knew the individual liked.

Lorraine had a true volunteer spirit. She regularly came to evening adoptions at the Petsmart locations and participated in many PAWS events.

Donations made in her honor to PAWS are being contributed to the SNAP Fund which assists in getting more pets and feral cats sterilized in order to help reduce the homeless pet population. This was a cause that Lorraine truly believed in and supported.

Lorraine is survived by her three sons, numerous grandchildren and great grandchildren.

**2009 By The Numbers**

2009 was another wonderful year as PAWS helped many animals in so many ways. Our foster families found permanent, loving homes for 260 animals (208 cats and 52 dogs). Through our Spay/Neuter Assistance Program (SNAP) we paid for, or subsidized, the cost of getting 280 “owned” and 74 feral cats sterilized. Additionally, our pet food bank program collected and distributed 1,293 pounds of dry food and 284 cans of food for dogs and 1,365 pounds of dry food and 102 cans of food for cats to hungry animals. This program just began in June of 2009! THANK YOU to all of our volunteers, donors, and adopters who helped make 2009 such a success for PAWS.

#### *An Angel Named Barbara*

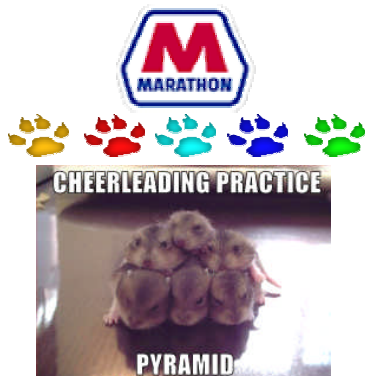

She calls monthly or sooner and is one of the most giving people I have ever met. She also brings a large box of "people" food for me to take when I drop off the pet food to the Food Pantry. She did say that she supports homeless veterans with food boxes and donates to another animal group. She does not want any credit for anything. She says it is not important how much money a person has, but what a person does with the money that is important, and that we were put here to do good for one another. She's a very inspiring lady. I always go away feeling very blessed after being around her."

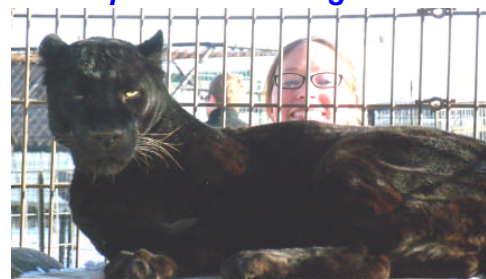
### She Had A Dream . . . Now It's A Reality!

Amanda Lafferty, a PAWS volunteer, graduated from Michigan State University with a Bachelor's degree in Zoology. Her dream has always been to work with big cats. Since she was unable to obtain a career of working with her big kitties immediately upon graduation due to the economy, she decided to volunteer with PAWS in order to stay close to the animals. Some of her first volunteer jobs were to clean cages and feed and water the shelter animals at the Wyandotte Animal Shelter. She soon discovered that the shelter animals were in desperate need of human attention, and she would do all she could to provide that to them.

Amanda also realizes the necessity of having cats and dogs spayed and neutered so that the problem of overpopulation can be diminished. She also assisted in applying for grants to open the new low-cost spay and neuter clinic and said she looks forward to the time of completion when the clinic will be a reality and knows the benefits of the clinic will bring so much to Downriver. Amanda stated that her participation as a volunteer, along with the experiences she received, were very beneficial and will aid her for the rest of her life.

Volunteering with PAWS has already helped make her dream a reality. She is now an exotic cat intern at Turpentine Creek Wildlife Refuge in Arkansas. This is a non-profit organization that rescues abused and abandoned big cats. She works with tigers, lions, leopards, cougars, bears and smaller cat species. She happily works six days a week, she has found her responsibilities are very similar to what she experienced as a volunteer at the Wyandotte Animal Shelter – but on a much **LARGER** scale!

Some of her additional responsibilities include animal husbandry, behavioral observations, recordkeeping, giving daily tours, landscaping, building new habitats and performing upkeep on them, as well as sorting and preparing meat for feeding. Each day a meeting is held where the caretakers report something unique that made their day better. That usually includes something adorable that one of the cats may have done. Working here has been a life-changing experience and being around big cats every day and knowing that she makes a difference in their life is part what has helped fulfill her dream. Amanda said she feels so very fortunate to have received this opportunity, and she is glad that PAWS played a part in that journey. ### Spay/Neuter Assistance Available

PAWS still has plenty of grant money available from our PetSmart Charities® low-income spay/neuter grant. This money allows us to offer extremely low prices for spaying and neutering to those who qualify. Through this program, the cost to have a dog sterilized is \$50, and a cat is \$20. Vaccines are a little extra.

Criteria include:

- 🐾 Residence in Wayne County, or the ability to drive to Wayne County (Taylor, Michigan) to complete paperwork and drop animal off/pick animal up.
- 🐾 Proof of need. This includes:
  - 🐾 Low income: \$10,830 per year or less for a single person or \$18,310 per year or less for a family of three. You must show an IRS tax form from 2009 to qualify.
  - 🐾 Currently unemployed. You must show a recent unemployment check.
  - 🐾 Government assistance: Social Security, Welfare, Medicaid, Bridge card. You must show proof of assistance.

For feral cats, you must assist in trapping the cats (we can loan traps) and be willing to provide ongoing care (food and shelter) for cats sterilized through this program. **We do not offer relocation services for feral cats.**

Even if you don't qualify for assistance based on the above criteria, the PAWS SNAP (Spay/Neuter Assistance Program) may still be able to help you with costs. Please see our website for more information or to apply for SNAP assistance.

### Shopping for the Animals

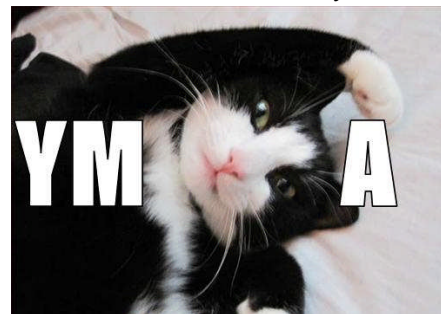
PAWS recently enrolled in the Kroger Community Rewards Program. This program allows Kroger Plus cardholders to designate a charity to receive a percentage of the money they spend at Kroger. It's a really easy way to help us raise money for the animals just by shopping!

If you already have a Kroger Plus card, you just need to go online and designate PAWS as your charity. of choice. If you don't have a card, you can pick one up at the customer service desk of your local Kroger, then go online and name PAWS as your charity. The instructions sent from Kroger are below. Even though the instructions look a little intimidating, it's very easy to register your card. **Our group number is 90339.**

- 🐾 To sign up online, go to: [krogercommunityrewards.com](http://krogercommunityrewards.com)
- 🐾 Be sure to have your Kroger Plus card handy so you can register it with PAWS after you sign up (first you register yourself, then you register your card to PAWS).

- 🐾 If you do not have a Kroger Plus card, you can get one at the customer service desk at any Kroger.
- 🐾 Click on *Sign In/Register*.
- 🐾 Most participants are new online customers, so they must click on *SIGN UP TODAY* in the "New Customer" box.
- 🐾 Sign up for a Kroger Rewards Account by entering zip code, clicking on favorite store, entering your e-mail address and creating a password and agree to the terms and conditions.
- 🐾 You will then get a message to check your e-mail inbox and click on the link within the body of the email.
- 🐾 Click on *My Account*, and use your e-mail address and password to proceed to the next step.
- 🐾 Click on *Edit Kroger Community Rewards* information and input your Kroger Plus card number.
- 🐾 Update or confirm your information.
- 🐾 Select *PAWS* from the available list and click to confirm.
- 🐾 To verify you are enrolled correctly, you will see your organization's name on the right side of your information page.
- 🐾 REMEMBER, purchases will not count for PAWS until after you register your card..
- 🐾 If you use your phone number at the register, call 1-877-576-7587 to get your Kroger Plus card number.
- 🐾 Members must swipe their registered Kroger Plus card or use the phone number that is related to their registered Kroger Plus card when shopping for each purchase to count.

There is an alternate SCANBAR method of member registration if you are unable to register online. Please call 1-800-837-4483, and a SCANBAR letter will be mailed to you.
